CARA LOGO CONTEST:

At the October CARA Board of Directors meeting a motion was approved to hold a contest to solicit submissions for a CARA Logo. A prize of \$100.00 will be awarded to the winner(s). Following are rules for logo submissions.

1. CARA can select one logo or ideas from several submissions. In that case the prize money would be split between the parties. CARA would also have the right to reject all submissions.
2. The logo would have to be approved by a majority of the board.
3. The design must look good in black and white and/or in color and be such that could be used on paper and items such as shirts.
4. Each submission would be given an identification number and the board would not know who had submitted any specific logo.
5. CARA will not be responsible for loss and will not return the logos.
6. Submissions are subject to editing.
7. Submission can be graphic and text.
8. The winning submission becomes the property of CARA and any trademarks or copy rights will belong to CARA.

9. Entries must be mailed in separately and be postmarked by Feb. 1, 99 and received by Feb. 6.

CARA Enhancement Awards

The CARA Board of Directors approved revisions to the CARA Bowling Enhancement Award Program at the September meeting. The changes were a result of a review of past awards.

The review revealed that there was a significant difference in the chances of bowlers at various level winning an award. Another review will be performed at the end of the season to determine how effective the changes are in correcting the imbalance. The award levels for this season are as follows:

Bowlers with averages under 140 can win an award for 70 pins over average or 110 over for set. Bowlers with averages 140 and above can win for 80 pins over average and 125 over for set.

Bowlers can also win an award for bowling a 280-299 scratch game or for bowling a 300 game.
